

# Stolen-recovered Honda CBR600 cracks 206mph

A five-year-old CBR600RR stolen just days before last year's Bonneville Speed Week notched 206mph in this year's event. The result shatters the previous class record by 36mph and tops the standard bike by nearly 50mph.

Admittedly the FL Racing CBR, ridden by American Dusty Schallar, benefited from taller gearing, a turbocharger, hunkered-down suspension and lightweight BST carbon wheels, but the result is pretty amazing nonetheless.

The CBR was set to run at Bonneville last year but was stolen and only recovered months later having been badly mistreated.

Crew Chief Chris Geiter and rider Schallar rebuilt the bike before taking the record. "It took a lot of effort for a 600cc motorcycle to achieve over 200 mph," Schallar understated massively.
